Alice: A thoughtful, curious child navigating a world governed by illogical rules. Alice's journey is about discernment and identity, learning when authority is meaningless and when logic has been distorted.

Alice's Mother: Firm, practical, and emotionally distant. She represents adult authority and expectation, setting the tone for the pressures Alice later encounters in Wonderland. Her presence grounds the story in the real world.

Alice's Sister: Confident, opinionated, and dismissive of Alice's imagination. She represents peer comparison and social judgment, reinforcing what is considered "normal" or acceptable behavior.

The Queen of Hearts: Calm, controlled, and terrifyingly arbitrary. The Queen represents absolute authority, enforcing rules without explanation or empathy. Her power lies in stillness and certainty.

The King of Hearts: Passive and weak. Represents authority that exists but refuses to act, allowing injustice to continue.

The Mad Hatter: Chaotic and socially unhinged. He rejects rules loudly but offers no alternative, representing rebellion without purpose and madness as performance.

The March Hare: Impulsive and excessive. Embodies unchecked indulgence and chaos.

The White Rabbit: Anxious and perpetually late. Embodies urgency, pressure, and fear of failure. His panic destabilizes everyone around him.

The Dormouse: Quiet, withdrawn, and fragile. Represents avoidance and emotional shutdown in an overwhelming world.

The Cheshire Cat: Charming and unsettling. Embodies twisted logic and gaslighting, making nonsense sound reasonable while enjoying confusion.

The Caterpillar: Calm and deliberate. Represents identity and transformation, forcing others to confront who they are becoming.

The Mock Turtle: Melancholy and deeply emotional. Represents grief, nostalgia, and emotional honesty.

The Dodo Bird: Self-important and officious. Symbolizes authority that organizes chaos without understanding it.

The Knave of Hearts: Nervous and opportunistic. Represents scapegoating within rigid systems where guilt is assigned without proof.

Tweedle Dee & Tweedle Dun: Confident and argumentative. Represents circular logic: endless debate without resolution.

Ensemble: The environment of Wonderland. Ensemble members shift roles to reinforce instability, conformity, and obedience to arbitrary rules.
